The programs are a venue for participants to explore ideas, gain insights, and enhance positive relationships among like-minded people.

The programs will be intellectually engaging and include social games and practical opportunities to explore personally and socially meaningful issues.

The moderator, Reverend Joseph Ben-David, recently returned from the Czech Republic, where he led interactive dialogues for gatherings sponsored by the distinguished Martin Buber Fund. They were received with great enthusiasm.
